

About us

Common Equity NSW (CENSW) is a registered Tier 2 Community Housing Provider and the Peak Body for Co-operative Housing in NSW. CENSW has been operating since 2009, specialising in the delivery of social and affordable Co-operative Housing (Co-operative Housing).

We are the only community housing provider in NSW to offer this unique and progressive community housing model. We are driven by a purpose to lead and grow Co-operative Housing across NSW and a vision to empower housing communities through our model.

CENSW offers a direct managed tenancy program as an alternate housing choice for tenants who prefer a more traditional social housing arrangement.



Co-operative Housing

Co-operative Housing is a community led housing model. It addresses the widening gap between social housing delivery and private market options. Innovating on traditional community housing delivery, Co-operative Housing puts residents in control of their own housing outcomes. Merging active participation, autonomy, and housing security, Co-operative Housing allows tenants to experience many benefits comparable to home ownership.

How it works

Each Housing Co-operative is led by a resident elected Co-operative Board. Like minded residents jointly manage their own cluster of community housing properties. The Co-operative's management role includes: property and tenancy management; rental income and Co-operative expenditure management; annual training; and annual Co-operative development planning.

The Benefits1

Co-operative Housing facilitates the development of genuine neighbour relationships, networks of social support and a web of personal resources. With a focus on community, Co-operative Housing delivers extensive wellbeing outcomes for residents. It generates a housing outcome which extends beyond secure accommodation to holistic quality of life improvements.

Housing Co-operatives occupy a diverse range of property types. Properties range from co-living arrangements – where common and shared areas are a key focus of the design; to multi-dwelling blocks; and free-standing houses.

The funding awarded to CENSW has been integral to our growth over recent years allowing us to increase in scope and seed fund co-operative specific developments.
